Operations Report - August 2019

- Granicus Issues: Completed UPDATE - This past week, Joe and I installed a new HD encoder for the City's Granicus meeting management, streaming and video archival tool. As soon as Granicus support configures the hardware, the issues should be rectified and CityOfPasadena.net will join PasadenaMedia.org in streaming KPAS in HD.
- Threat to Franchise Fees & PEG: FCC Proposed Rulemaking, MB Docket No. 05-311 UPDATE - The Third Report and Order was published in the Federal Register on August 27, which means it takes effect on September 26. At that time, it is possible that Charter will begin retaining some franchise fee dollars for maintenance of the I-Net that is used to deliver our channel signals from City Hall and PUSD to the headend. Similarly, AT&T could charge for maintenance of the T1 lines. I have spoken with the Finance Department at the City to determine what, if any, other in-kind services Charter and AT&T provide that may be deducted. The Alliance for Community Media Board of Directors authorized a legal appeal of the FCC's actions at its August meeting. ACM will be working with counsel at Spiegel McDiarmid on the appeal to represent members' interests in court. Multiple municipalities will also appeal the FCC's actions.
- New Studio B: In Progress

We have conducted two test shows with single and three-camera setups. Lighting is the last technical component to be integrated. Policies and procedures are being determined and are expected to roll out with the first training course in late September.

• Audit: Field Work Completed

A representative of the City's auditor was in our office for approximately one week to conduct field work for our annual audit. We worked with our accountant to ensure timely delivery of all necessary information and have asked that their first draft be prepared by mid-September. Our intention is to have our final draft ready for the PCAC October board meeting so that you can approve it for delivery to the City.

- Green Room Water Leak Repair: In Progress A plastic water line and our instant hot water heater failed last week causing a leak that damaged the wall between suites 100 & 101. We have an estimate of \$500 for a new water heater and are awaiting an estimate for repair of the wall.
- Liability Insurance: Reviewed and Renewed As we do each year, we assessed our liability insurance costs and needs. We renewed our liability coverage with our current carrier.
- Council Chamber Audio Issues: Completed We worked with DoIT and their vendor to adjust microphone levels. While it is unknown why the levels changed, our team now has a better understanding of where this issue exists in the software interface and can rectify the issue if it happens again.

Production Report - August 2019

- 28 productions and pre-production meetings were scheduled in the studio for Arroyo channel producers. Arroyo Originals consisted of 17 production held in the studio and 7 productions shot in the field. 12 productions were covered for KPAS and 6 productions were covered for pro services.
- Current/Potential Partnerships:
 - Rotary 100 Years Anniversary Video
 - Leadership Pasadena 20th Anniversary Luncheon
 - MASH Trainee Recruitment Promotional Video
- Notable Completed Productions Include:
 - Pro Services Late Nite Bride: Pasadena Media staff has been hired by Arroyo producer Peggy Kelley to capture behind-the-scenes of her wedding coordination process to highlight on her access program. A Pasadena Media staff member has also been hired to act as the director for her production date in September.
 - Pro Services *HR Tips in a Minute:* Five members from the City of Pasadena's Human Resources Department came into the studio and recorded several videos to answer frequently asked questions from other City departments. The Human Resources Department plans on continuing to work with Pasadena Media to create an ongoing series of these videos for internal purposes.
 - *District 5 Community Meeting:* First district meeting covered for Councilmember Victor Gordo
- Notable Upcoming Productions:
 - *City of Giving:* The first segment is scheduled for early September. The four nonprofits to be featured in the first episode are Union Station Homeless Services, Day One, Leadership Pasadena and AbilityFirst.
 - *At Your Service*: Pasadena Media staff will capture a segment called "Let's Talk Trash," where three city staff members are quizzed on various recyclable items.
 - Heat Watch: Pasadena Media will be covering Next Rung Pasadena
 Firefighters Local 809 charity boxing demonstration, an event designed to raise awareness for first responder mental health.

Channel Managers Meeting - August 20, 2019

Alexander Boekelheide, PCC Representative / PCC TV, present Lisa Derderian, City Manager Representative / KPAS, present Beth Leyden, PUSD Representative / KLRN, present Chris Miller, PCAC COO / Arroyo, present

The Channel Managers met at John Muir High School to discuss current and future PEG-related needs, PEG capital funding and tour the school's media facility.

Miller briefly discussed that PCAC will address upcoming equipment needs when lease negotiations begin. This is scheduled to occur before the Windows 7 end-of-life in January 2020. Needs related to this issue include our TriCaster 460 switcher, TriCaster Mini switcher and Cablecast channel playback systems. Replacement costs are projected at ~\$100,000. KLRN and PCC TV may have similarly affected systems, which Boekelheide and Leyden will research.

Miller also briefly discussed possible expenses for the City Hall 20% PEG fund balance. Given PCAC's responsibilities regarding administration of PEG funding, Miller strives to keep the channel managers and PCAC board apprised of any uses of that funding. Potential uses cited by the City's Dept. of Information Technology (DoIT) include installation of fiber optic cable and upgrading the central library auditorium which could both be used by PCAC. Currently, City staff is discussing a profanity delay system. Miller has recommended a ~\$6000 turnkey system.

Boekelheide presented the attached detail about the project. Motion to recommend to PCAC board by Boekelheide, second by Leyden; approved unanimously.

Upgrading the stage projection system in Sexson Auditorium

Sexson Auditorium, PCC's largest classroom and performance venue, with a capacity of roughly 1,800 seats in two levels, has limited capability to project images, video, and other material on an onstage screen. The current system has limited candlepower (very dim) and resolution (non-widescreen and non-HD), and little ability to accept inputs suitable for live performance or broadcast. PCC proposes to upgrade the system to include a new screen, new projector system, and new switching elements to vastly increase the college's ability to project images on the screen in this venue.

With an upgraded projection system, PCC theater and music productions, as well as large lectures and public events, will be able to use high-quality digital projection as part of their production plan, making broadcast of these elements on PCCTV possible and expanding the audience for this material.
