Pasadena Community Access Corporation Board of Directors Meeting

Tuesday, October 2, 2018 - 7:00 PM

- City has identified their cost reduction measures, which includes a \$50K reduction in our operating revenue. As indicated to the board as of last month, we will be required to transfer up to \$50K from our savings account to cover our operating budget.
- Pasadena Media successfully taped *IMPACT Pasadena* with host Hoyt Hilsman and guest Assemblymember Chris Holden. We will not air these episodes this month due to the impending November election.
- Attended Innovate Pasadena's "Cocktail Reception" event held at Constance Hotel, honoring former Mayor Bogaard. In attendance with me was Aaron Wheeler.
- Met with PCAC Citizens Advisory Committee member Robert Gorski to continue our discussion and planning regarding his program *Access for All*, which offers information for the disabled community.
- Attended the PCAC Board Retreat with administration staff to discuss PCAC's Strategic Plan; details forthcoming.
- Produced a video regarding disaster preparedness called *Map Your Neighborhood: The Plan In Action* with the assistance of Interim Public Information Officer Lisa Derderian and our District 4 Board Member Perry Helm. The video has been well received by the community.
- Attended the Rose City Center's Board of Directors Meeting.

- Met with Noreen Sullivan, Councilmember Gene Masuda's Representative for District 4 to discuss various issues regarding her district including *Map Your Neighborhood*.
- Attended the Kheir Center's 32nd Annual Fundraising Dinner & Awards Event at the InterContinental Los Angeles in Downtown LA. Kheir Center's mission is to provide access to culturally and linguistically-sensitive quality primary health care and human services to the underserved and uninsured residents of Southern California.
- Met with former Mayor Bill Bogaard to discuss the upcoming tax initiative and other City-related issues.
- Pasadena Media is exploring options for space, as our lease expires October 2019; details forthcoming.
- Staff members Danielle Ross, Chavel DeVine and Aaron Wheeler are working on revenue generation via stock footage licensing.
- Phil Hopkins and Aaron Wheeler are developing new metrics for social media; details forthcoming.

Notable Operations Projects and Their Statuses - Prepared by Chris Miller, Chief Operations Officer

Granicus Issues: Ongoing

Several issues with the recording and streaming of City Council meetings have occurred since the break in August. During this time, I have been talking with the Dept. of Information Technology who oversees the Granicus video and meeting management suite to determine how to proceed.

Operating Budget Revision: Revenue Updated

During our recent quarterly request for funds, we worked with City staff to absorb the \$50,000 annual budget deduction over the last three quarters.

Liability Insurance: Reviewed and Renewed

As we do each September, we assessed our liability insurance costs and needs. We renewed our liability coverage with our current carrier.

City KPIs: Meeting Postponed

The City's Finance Department has reached out to all departments and operating companies to review and update key performance indicators in preparation for the City's annual report and next year's budget cycle. We were prepared for a meeting with a Finance staff member two weeks ago, but they postponed.

Net Neutrality: New California Law

On Sunday, Governor Brown signed SB-822 into law. This is widely regarded as the strongest Net Neutrality rules of any state. To sum it up, the protections that the FCC removed several months ago are back in place in California. However, the Dept. of Justice has filed a lawsuit to overturn the law.

Charter Communication Inc, based in Stamford CT and doing business nationally under the same "Spectrum" now provides next-generation optic fiber internet services to select areas of the country.

However, by its own (written) admission, in areas with service is available, it refuses to connect small businesses to its optic fiber network if they are "located in a residence".

This policy disadvantages thousands of small businesses throughout the country.

Does the FCC permit a national ISP to discriminate in its supply of service based purely on the zoning category of the customer's premises?

Karen,

Thanks again for all your efforts. It's certainly disappointing to read that the California Public Utilities Commission is so unresponsive to consumer questions about violations of DIVCA, even when those questions are mediated by their Assemblymember's office. I have to say CPUC's unresponsiveness makes something of a mockery of the claims on their website:

"The PUC intends to vigorously enforce the antidiscrimination rules and build-out requirements of the DIVCA to ensure that the "Digital Divide" is narrowed in California. An enforcement process is set forth in the video franchise decision that makes it clear that the PUC intends to enforce these provisions, using sanctions ranging from monetary fines, suspension, and revocation of the video franchise license"

Since it's been 60 days since I submitted my original question to Chris Holden, with no sign of an answer in sight, I decided to do my own research. Here's what I found out this weekend:

1. DIVCA does not precisely define a "Cable", but if we assume the Act applies to Optic Fiber Internet Services, then:
2. Franchisees are required to comply with the California Public Utilities Code (<http://www.bwslaw.com/tasks/sites/bwslaw/assets/Image/82.pdf>)
3. PUC section 5890(a) (as referenced here: <https://codes.findlaw.com/ca/public-utilities-code/puc-sect-5890.html>) says a state-franchised cable operator may not deny access to a group of potential residential subscribers based on income.
4. So if a franchisee refuses to provide services to a customer purely because that customer operates from a building that is zoned "residential", then the franchisee would appear to be discriminating against smaller businesses with lower income, contrary to PUC-5890(a).
5. On this basis, the policy of Charter Communications, as set out in the email from their Enterprise Services division (submitted as an attachment to my original question) would appear to be a violation of California Law.

Does my AssemblyMember agree? I'm confident there are thousands of home-based businesses in his district who won't be happy about being discriminated against by Charter Communications in this way. I'm sure they will either now, or in the future, be grateful for any support he can give them.
